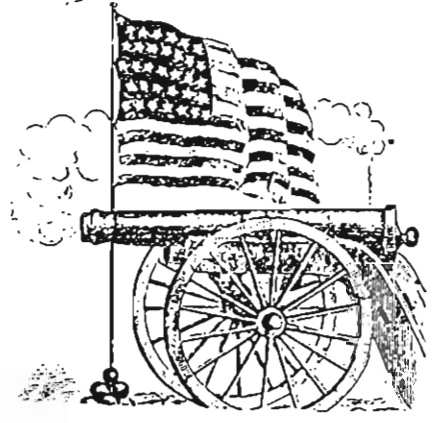

Note 1: "Although counties have been required to report the party affiliation of California's registered voters since 1915, the first statewide record did not appear until 1922, and no records are available prior to that date." See Eugene C. Lee, *California Votes 1928 - 1960*, Institute of Governmental Studies, University of California, 1963, quoted at page 26.

Note 2: Prior to 1944, the presidential primary was held in May, and a second primary was held in September or August to nominate partisan candidates for congress, the state senate, and the assembly. In 1944, these primary elections were consolidated into a single primary election date.

Note 3: Since the statewide primary election party nomination process began in 1910, fifteen parties have qualified to conduct primary elections, including:

California's first absentee voters were Civil War soldiers who were allowed to vote where they were stationed. Ballots of Company A, Second Massachusetts Cavalry — the California One Hundred — were cast in Centreville, Virginia, in 1863 then mailed back to the Secretary of State in California.

Some soldiers supplied unique write-in candidates of their own. One voter put forth Emperor Norton I, a colorful character of the time, as candidate for Governor. Norton, once a successful real estate broker in San Francisco, fell on hard times and chose to cope with his recent business failures by proclaiming himself emperor of the United States and Protector of Mexico.

These original Civil War ballots and other historic election materials are preserved in the California State Archives.
